Literacy

This half term, Y5 will begin by reading and analysing the book 'Something Else' by Katherine Cave and will then write their own narratives. They will move onto non-fiction with an outcome of writing a set of instructions. In addition to this, Y5 will:

- use cohesive devices to link text e.g. pronouns, adverbs and adverbial phrases
- write narratives with clear plot and structures
- use standard English when writing and speaking.
- include descriptions of settings and characters
- use a range of sentence structures
- apply taught spelling rules
- use apostrophes to show contractions and possessives.
- plan, draft and edit their written work.
- use a dictionary to check meanings.



Numeracy

This half term we will be focusing on number work, children will be:



- comparing and ordering numbers beyond 1000000
- rounding any number to the nearest 10, 100, 1 000, 10 000 and 100 000
- interpret negative numbers in context, count forwards and backwards with positive and negative whole numbers including through zero
- solving number and practical problems with large positive numbers
- reading and writing Roman numerals to 1000 (M)
- estimating and using inverse operations to check answers to a calculation
- writing and calculating mathematical statements for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division

Topic: The Vile Victorians

During our work in Topic, which focuses on the Victorians, children will be focusing on Queen Victoria's reign, and the great changes the UK experienced. They will learn the differences between town and cities, the Poor and Rich British colonies, Queen Victoria's family entertainment, schools, Christmas and the Industrial revolution.

Key subject skills:

- asking and responding to geographical questions about their local area, the UK and the world
- using appropriate geographical vocabulary in communicating findings
- describing, comparing and offering reasons for their views
- interpreting information from different types of atlases, globes, maps and plans at a range of scales
- using secondary sources of information and ICT as part of investigations
- communicating knowledge and understanding in a variety of ways
- investigating, designing, planning and making playgrounds,

Science

We will be deepening our knowledge of forces. Examining how forces can be manipulated to make objects move differently or to stop them from moving. We will study how forces can be balanced in order to create a particular outcome.
